More than one in 10 Americans either has or is at risk of developing a bone disease. Yet the vast majority of these individuals remain undiagnosed and untreated. As a result, bone disease exacts a huge toll on the nation. Osteoporosis, by far the most common bone disease, is responsible for approximately 1.5 million fractures each year. As many as 300, 000 individuals who suffer an osteoporosisrelated fracture die as a result of complications from the injury. A core component of this campaign was the Surgeon Generals Workshop on Osteoporosis and Bone Health, held December 12th and 13th of 2002 in Washington, DC.
